<u>Pupil Request Forms for Textbook, Health, Counseling Aid/Services:</u> To be completed and filed at the nonpublic school on behalf of the student no later than <u>September 15, 2023</u>.

Student Report For Aids to Nonpublic Students (ED 01650-26): Pupil Request Forms signed on or before the September 15 deadline, must be summarized and submitted to the office of the Superintendent at the Detroit Lakes Public School district by October 1, 2023.
